EDUCATIONAL HEALTH PROGRAM

The Educational Health Program provides no cost workshops that are held each month through the facilitation of uncompensated individual volunteers and/or other non-profit organizations/agencies with expertise or knowledge in each of the target areas of health concern(s). The Educational Health Program is exclusively for public charitable and educational purposes which does not promote or make specific referrals to anyone specific organization. As a continuous annual program designed to benefit individuals for providing education for, but not limited to nutritional education, CPR and first aid certifications, free or low cost preventative care for immunizations, flu shots, eye glasses, dental cleanings, physicals and health screenings for, diabetes, sickle cell, hypertension, breast and prostate cancers. Informational presentations will also be held on other these and other health related and areas of interest such as, but not limited to the areas of the effects of tobacco and tobacco related products, autism, sickle cell, ADHD/ADD, Alzheimer's disease and strokes. Each education session enables individuals the opportunity to live longer healthier lives as other members in the greater society.

EDUCATIONAL SAFETY PROGRAM

The Educational Safety Program provides public no cost workshops that are held each month through the facilitation of uncompensated individual volunteers and/or other non-profit organizations/agencies with expertise or knowledge in each of the target areas of Safety concern(s). The Educational Safety Program is exclusively for public charitable and educational purposes which does not promote or make specific referrals to anyone specific organization. The Educational Safety Program is a continuous annual program for assistance and solutions for providing active neighborhood involvement for decreasing crime, gang activity, re-emergence of the neighborhood watch, self defense classes, ways to

improve home security, fire prevention in and around your home, disaster and emergency readiness, child and elderly fingerprinting and safe house campaigns. All of these areas enable each individual the opportunity to live peacefully and feel secure in and around where they live, sleep and play as other members in the greater society.

EDUCATIONAL ECONOMIC PROGRAM

As a future project of Valentine's Heart, in late fiscal year of 2010, The Economic Program provides public no cost emergency assistance and additional resource referrals to other outside no-cost and/or non-profit organizations/agencies. The Economic Program is exclusively for public charitable and educational purposes which does not promote or make specific referrals to anyone specific organization. The program provides emergency financial support to those in need of assistance for:

- moving expense due to an eviction
- voucher for eye glasses
- prescription medication
- food/food vouchers
- bus tokens/passes
- utility disconnect notices
- other – case by case basis

In order to receive emergency financial support each applicant must meet specific eligibility requirements. Each applicant must show proof of at least one of the eligibility requirements of: 1) disabled, 2) elderly 3) cares for children in the home; 4) and/or must demonstrate financial need based on income. Emergency relief payments will be made directly to the agency that has the delinquent account and not directly to the applicant except in the cases of food distribution, transportation assistance or other instances which will be evaluated on a case by case basis.

EDUCATIONAL LEARNING PROGRAM

The Educational Learning Program provides public no cost workshops that are held each month through the facilitation of uncompensated individual volunteers and/or other non-profit organizations/agencies with expertise or knowledge in each of the target areas of Education concern(s). The Educational Learning Program is exclusively for public charitable and educational purposes which does not promote or make specific referrals to anyone specific organization. This program is a continuous designated to benefit those in need of educational assistance through an annual school supply give a way, test taking and study skills as well as tutoring, a virtual self-paced interactive SAT, ACT and GED test preparation. Through the use of technology and study aids, the tutoring lab emphasizes the subjects of math, writing and vocabulary building. These self-paced interactive test programs are able to test and analyze the individual's strengths and weaknesses. Study skills workshops focusing on study and test taking skills that will enhance each individual study habits as well as preparing them mentally, physically and emotionally before they are engaged in each educational task as it is administered. Tutoring sessions are also another component of our Education Program that that will also assist and support students who request additional assistance with difficult areas of study or just simple brain storming session to complete school assignments or projects. The Far And Away Program provides the opportunity for at risk youth to travel to different places within the United States that they would not ordinarily visit due to social or economic challenges. Far and Away also provides for exploration, education, challenges, building of life skills, new perspectives, opportunities and experiences to various cultures and environments that are not their own. Lastly, The School Supply Give a Way is as a means to assist needy children who are in need of school supplies. The School Supply Give A Way in August 2008 assisted over 2,700 children with school supplies to include, but not limited to backpacks, various types of paper, binders, index cards, Kleenex, composition books, pencils, crayons, markers, protractors, rulers, graph paper, erasers, and other needed items.
